Wisconsin Supreme Court overrules Safer at Home

The Wisconsin Supreme Court ruled 4-3 today that Gov. Tony Evers' administration overreached its authority when Department of Health Services Secretary Andrea Palm extended the Safer at Home to run until May 26.

The majority opinion was written by four of the court's conservatives, including Chief Justice Patience Roggensack and Justices Rebecca Bradley, Daniel Kelly and Annette Ziegler. Conservative justice Brian Hagedorn joined the court's two liberal justices Ann Walsh Bradley and Rebecca Dallet in dissent.
